The Center for Disease Control recommends that the following individuals receive a flu shot this year: Adults and children age 2 to 50 with chronic medical conditions:

- Children age 6 months to 18 years on chronic aspirin
- therapy.Anyone over the age of 50.
- All women who will be pregnant during the flu season.
- All children from 6 months through 18 years of age.
- Health-care workers involved in direct patient care.
- Out-of-home caregivers and household contacts of children under 6 months.
- Residents of nursing homes and long-term care facilities.
- Anyone with medical conditions that puts them at a higher risk for severe complications from flu.

Health care providers may also recommend a yearly flu vaccination for:

- People who provide essential community services.
- People living in **dormitories**, **correctional facilities**, or under other **crowded conditions**, to prevent outbreaks.
- People at high risk of flu complications who **travel** to the Southern hemisphere between April and September, or to the tropics or in organized tourist groups at any time.

If you meet the criteria and are a Kaiser Permanente member attend one of the flu shot clinics at a Kaiser Permanente medical facility near you.
