The following materials can be taken to one of the collection sites for recycling or safer disposal:

oil-based paints (**no latex**) • shellacs, varnishes, and polyurethanes
primers and sealers • spray paint • adhesives • wood stains • paint thinner
mercury (must be sealed in a plastic bag or container)
pesticides, insecticides and herbicides • automotive products • motor oil
roof tar • fluorescent bulbs • household cleaners (oven and drain)

Turn in your mercury thermometer sealed in a plastic bag or container and receive a new thermometer. Limited supply available.

Residential Waste Only!

Materials from businesses will not be accepted.

Also not accepted: tires, latex paint, propane tanks, household batteries
